Dear Friends and Supporters of Adelante Mujer,

As we close out 2024, I find myself overwhelmed with gratitude—for the women whose lives have been transformed through education, for the communities they now serve, and for the extraordinary generosity of people like you who make this all possible.

This year has been one of exciting growth and powerful momentum for Adelante Mujer. We celebrated 14 graduates, bringing the total to 89, each a woman who has overcome significant barriers to become a medical professional serving her community with skill, compassion, and strength. These women are not only transforming their own futures—they are changing the future of healthcare in Central America.

During the year, 60 students in Nicaragua received monthly financial support from Adelante Mujer, enabling them to continue their education with dignity and focus. And in 2024, we joyfully expanded our reach into Guatemala, where 6 remarkable women were enrolled in our first year of programming, now on their journey to become nurses.

One of those women is Aurelia, a dedicated nursing student who embodies the perseverance and heart of so many in our program. Every weekday, she rises before dawn to catch a bus that takes her two hours—each way—to reach her school. This is not an uncommon story. Many of our students walk long distances, ride multiple buses, and navigate daily hardship just to sit in a classroom. And yet, they persist. They show up. And they thrive.

Aurelia's story reminds us that access to education is not just about tuition—it's about breaking through the physical, financial, and social barriers that stand between a woman and her future. Thanks to your support, we're helping to remove those barriers, one student at a time.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are more committed than ever to continuing this work. Our goals include growing our funding base, expanding our presence in Guatemala, and exploring support for women in additional medical disciplines.


Because when a woman becomes a healer, she brings life not only to her patients—but to her family, her village, and her country.

A message from a mother...

"With deep gratitude and tears of emotion, I write this email. I want to express everything my heart feels for the financial support given to my beloved daughter, Heydi, throughout these years of academic preparation in her medical studies.

I am a single mother with many health issues: heart disease, high blood pressure, diabetes, arthritis, hypothyroidism, among other conditions. Only God has given me the strength to carry on. I require medical attention every month for the treatments I receive, and even with my greatest effort, it was very difficult for me to fully support my daughter. But God blessed her by placing you in her path to contribute financially to her well-being. There were moments when I felt hopeless because of our financial situation. Many times, I thought about ending my life because I couldn't support my daughter in all that she needed. But you were there to lighten my burden. I have always believed that it is God working through valuable people like you. From the bottom of my heart, I wish you a long life and hope that you continue supporting more women in making their dreams come true.

I grew up in a very poor family—we were 10 siblings, and my mother raised us alone by working as a housekeeper. I always wanted something better for my daughters. Thank you so much for contributing to her well-being." -Samanta




A message from a student..







2024 Highlights...

89 women have graduated as medical doctors since the program began—generally now serving their communities with skill and compassion.

60 students received monthly financial support in Nicaragua to continue their medical education, covering books, supplies, transportation, and living expenses.

Program improvements in 2024 included a new funding distribution model to increase consistency, reduce transaction issues, and ensure all students receive timely support.

Student and graduate testimonials poured in, expressing gratitude, emotional impact, and stories of resilience, showing the deep human effect of Adelante Mujer..


4 graduates received their MINSa License after completing their 3 year government service and post graduate research paper

Strengthened relationships with local universities and faculty mentors, helping ensure academic and emotional support throughout the students' journeys.

Students completed clinical rotations in rural hospitals and health posts, often serving communities with little to no other access to medical care.
